ART 240 - PAINTING ART, CONCEPTS AND THEORIES SYLLABUS (3+0) 3 credits 5 ECTS

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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

• It is a general introduction to the concepts, theories and types of painting on the basis of the principles of painting art.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- 1. To comprehend the personal development and interdisciplinary importance of the art of painting, which is a branch of fine arts. (1, 6)
- 2. To develop visual communication skills and a multidimensional perspective (2, 3, 4)
- 3. To gain knowledge about the art of painting by learning the concepts, working methods, and techniques of painting at a basic theoretical level. (5)
- 4. To learn the principles and elements of visual organization of art of painting at basic level (1, 2, 3)
- 5. To learn the types of painting according to their techniques and subjects and to comprehend the basic cultural structure and logic in these genres (1, 3)
- 6. To be able to comprehend visual art theories at a basic level through the art of painting, which is the dominant branch of visual arts. (1, 3)
- 7. To develop theoretical and conceptual thinking skills (1,2,4,5,6)

COURSE OUTCOMES:

- 1. Expression skills can be developed with the cultural achievements of the art of painting.
- 2. The habit of multiple vision can be acquired with the ability to look differently towards the perceived objects.
- **3.** It can be understood that geometric shapes and elements can be found in every object, in every composition and every landscape, and that through their explorations, the act of design can be mastered more strongly.
- **4.** In courses based on visual perception, a practical contribution can be made to field development in courses based on visual perception.
- **5.** To have knowledge about the basic concepts and theories of the art of painting.
- **6.** As a social and personal need, current culture-art objects can be consciously monitored and the interdisciplinary importance of art can be comprehended.

COURSE METHOD:

Theoretical lecture accompanied by video and visual presentation, discussion environment with question and answer system-active participation, instant question-answer repetitive topic reinforcement, evaluation with end-of-course quiz-oral exams/midterm exam and final exam.
